STAR continues to engage with young people in as many ways as we can and offer support to teachers and parents at this time. We have progressed to developing pre-recorded Online Sessions which can be access by anyone online. We are also able to deliver live online sessions for groups of young people via their school or youth setting. These will cover the usual Relationships & Sex Education topics that STAR normally delivers in Schools and Youth settings, but in addition will include support on home learning, mental health, wellbeing and managing anxieties.
